

Lame Duck Scenarios

- Many of our priorities depend on whether Democrats maintain control of the White House and Senate.
 - After election season, Members of Congress are less concerned with political factors.
- The remaining congressional calendar will likely be spent funding the government.
 - The odds the remaining appropriations bills pass are extremely low.
 - Another CR funding at last year's levels is most likely
- NECA will continue to push for Permitting Reform and Targeted Tax Provisions in the lame duck session





Political Recap: 118th Congress


- NECAPAC has raised over \$1.3 million this cycle
 - \$853.570 from 645 donors in 2023
 - \$530,435 from 431 donors YTD
- NECAPAC has disbursed over \$1.3 this cycle anticipated to total \$1.8
 - \$929,000 disbursed to reelect for 161 candidates in 39 states
 - \$235,000 disbursed to party PACs
 - \$167,500 disbursed to party sponsorships
- The Operational Fund has broken records this cycle
 - \$448,274 raised in 2023 from 216 contributors
 - \$354,985 raised from 91 contributors YTD (\$55k over Aug '23)





